



## Who Am I?

If you were asked to give multiple answers to the question “Who am I?” how would you respond? If you are a follower of Jesus Christ, does this make any difference to how you view yourself? When we become Christians, we experience life in a way that we never knew it before and we begin to appreciate who we really are. ### SELF-WORTH: I AM A PERSON OF VALUE BECAUSE...

- God made me and I belong to him (**Psalm 100:3**)
- I am precious and honoured (**Isaiah 43:4**)
- He loves me with an everlasting and unfailing love (**Jeremiah 31:3**)
- He knows me intimately and considers me to be of great worth (**Matthew 10:29-31**)
- Jesus calls me his friend (**John 15:15**)
- I have been made right with God through Jesus Christ (**Romans 5:1**)

### SECURITY: I AM A PERSON WHO BELONGS BECAUSE...

- The Lord has never forsaken nor abandoned me (**Psalm 9:10**)
- The Lord makes my future secure (**Psalm 16:5**)
- I know the Lord is always with me (**Psalm 16:8**)
- God has promised his people great peace and security (**Jeremiah 33:6**)
- No-one can snatch me out of Jesus’ hand (**John 10:28**)
- The Lord is my helper (**Hebrews 13:6**)

### SIGNIFICANCE: I AM A PERSON WITH PURPOSE BECAUSE...

- God has a purpose for me (**Psalm 57:2**)
- I’ve been given a job to do by and for Jesus Christ (**John 15:16**)
- My purpose is to please the Lord (**2 Corinthians 5:9**)
- I can come to God with confidence through Jesus Christ (**Ephesians 3:12**)
- My purpose is to finish the race God has marked out for me and receive the prize (**Philippians 3:14**)
- I can do everything through the strength of Christ (**Philippians 4:13**)
